Al Generated Session Notes

- Microsoft talked about the potential of AI to fundamentally change the way we work and live. They discussed the results of their annual Work Trend Index survey, which showed that 64% of employees feel like they don't have enough time and energy to do their jobs.
- Microsoft discussed the need for new skilling in the era of AI and the importance of formulating a plan and strategy for AI in organizations.
- Microsoft discussed three steps to become an Al-powered organization: 1/ Foundational Productivity, 2/ Al and Automation, and 3/ High Performance Organization. Microsoft 365 provides a comprehensive solution to help organizations become Al-ready.
- Microsoft outlined how AI can be used to reduce the weight of work and how Bing Chat Enterprise can help protect business data. Derek Snyder then demonstrated how Bing Chat Enterprise can be used to do competitive research, create product launch plans, and create product positioning statements.
- Microsoft discussed the use of AI tools to reduce the workload of employees, but warned that this could put business data at risk.
- Microsoft discussed the use of Bing Chat Enterprise to create a product launch plan and messaging to differentiate from competitors. They then introduced Microsoft 365
 Copilot, a tool that combines natural language processing with data from productivity tools like Word, PowerPoint, Outlook, and Teams.
- Microsoft Copilot was discussed in the meeting. It is a generative AI that will reason across all of an organization's business data. It will be able to tell users about meetings, emails, chats, and files they have access to.

- Microsoft discussed the use of their Al product, Copilot, to help with tasks such as asking
 questions and finding data from SharePoint sites, Word documents, PowerPoint, chats,
 emails, and the internet.
- Microsoft talked about how their AI-equipped in-app experience can help users save time and be more productive. They demonstrated how Copilot can be used in Outlook, Word documents, and Teams to summarize emails, transform documents, and provide intelligent meeting recaps.
- Microsoft discussed the use of AI in their app experience, specifically in Outlook. They
 demonstrated how Copilot can provide a summary of emails, even those in lengthy
 threads, and can provide suggested answers when replying.
- Microsoft discussed the use of their Outlook app, documents, and Copilot to save time
 and create presentations. They discussed how Copilot can be used to transform
 documents into different forms and how it can summarize content from a Word
 document into a PowerPoint presentation.
- Microsoft discussed a Copilot feature which allows users to follow meetings without attending them. It provides a video of the meeting, topics generated by AI, segments the meeting into chapters, and highlights mentions of the user.
- Microsoft talked about tMicrosoft 365 Copilot, and the benefits it provides to customers.
 It is powered by three foundational technologies: Microsoft 365 apps, the Microsoft Graph, and a large language model. It helps with collaboration, comprehension, and creation.
- Microsoft discussed the benefits of using their Copilot tool, which is being used by over 600 customers. The three main benefits are improved collaboration, better comprehension of data, and easier creation of documents.
- Microsoft discussed the use of their Copilot tool to help with various tasks such as installing cables, creating business proposals, and responding to customer queries.
- Microsoft talked about their various products and their lineup, including Bing Chat, Bing Chat Enterprise, Microsoft 365 Copilot, and Copilot in Microsoft Viva. They discussed how these products can help employees become more productive and engaged, and how they can help organizations achieve better business outcomes.
- Microsoft discussed their lineup of products, including Bing Chat, Bing Chat Enterprise, and Microsoft 365 Copilot. Bing Chat is powered by GPT 4 and is great for personal use, while Bing Chat Enterprise provides commercial data protection.



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- Microsoft introduced role-based Copilots and discussed the power of Sales Copilot, a
 tool that brings together all the day-to-day needs of sales teams and personalizes how
 they interact with customers.
